Crash Course in HTML: URLs and Tables

URLs

- URL stands for Ultimate Resource Location (or web page address, in plain English);
- Parts of the URL: http://www.schoolnova.org/student_area/john/index.html?search=homework
 - ◆ **http://** - protocol or schema
 - ◆ **www.schoolnova.org** – domain name (the organization that controls domain names is called ICANN)
 - ◆ **/student_area/john/index.html** – path
 - ◆ **?search=homework** – query string

Tables

<table border="1">
  <tr>
    <th>Header 1</th>
    <th>Header 2</th>
  </tr>
  <tr>
    <td>row 1, cell 1</td>
    <td>row 1, cell 2</td>
  </tr>
  <tr>
    <td>row 2, cell 1</td>
    <td>row 2, cell 2</td>
  </tr>
</table>

- Table and TR tags can have a “width” attribute.
- The “width” attribute value can be expressed in percentages of the container (e.g. width=“25%”) or in pixels (e.g. width=“200”).
- TR and TD tags can have the “align” attribute, the values of which can be “left (default), right, center or justified.”
- Example: <tr align=“center” width=“25%”>
