Instantaneous Speed

Earlier, we defined **Average speed**: between times t_i and t_f :

$$\vec{v} = \frac{d}{\Delta t}$$

$$d \longrightarrow ext{Distance traveled}$$
 $\Delta t = t_f - t_i \longrightarrow ext{Travel time}$

$$\Delta t = t_f - t_i \quad o \quad ext{Travel time}$$

Instantaneous speed tells you how fast an object moves right now, at specific time t. The formula is the same as above, but Δt must be as small as possible.

In science, the Greek letter Δ usually represents the change or difference of a quantity. For example, Δt would represent the change in time between two events.


Homework 4
